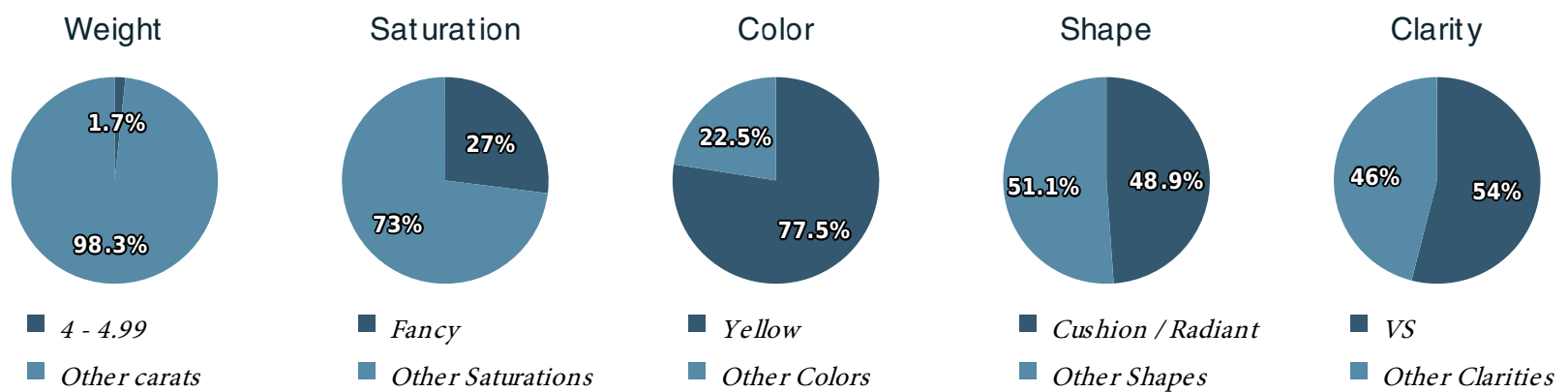

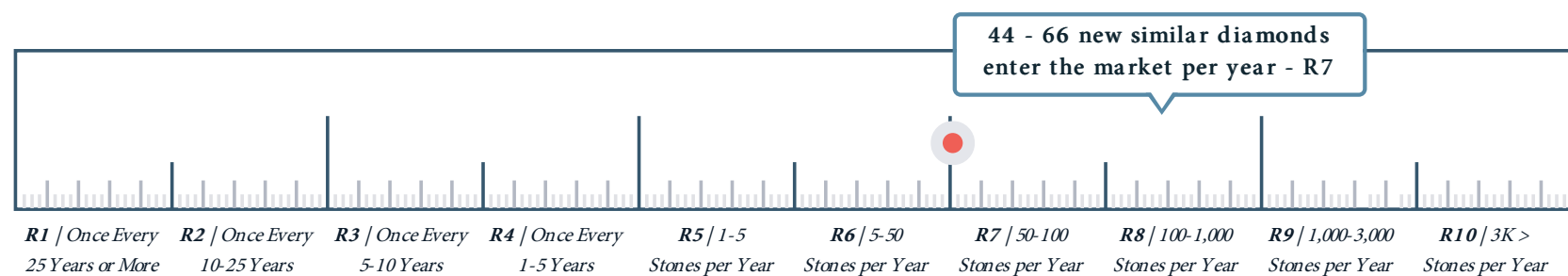

The rarity report analyzes rarity out of approximately 60,000 stones that are submitted to the GIA every year.

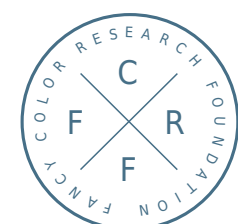
Diamond Rarity Scale



General

Only 3% of all diamonds above 1 carat submitted to grading labs are classified as fancy color. Yellow diamonds represent only 77.5% of all fancy color diamonds. Yellow fancy color diamonds have the highest demand of all natural diamond color. The result of yellow color in diamonds is due to a significant amount of nitrogen molecules absorbing blue light waves. Some exceptional Vivid Yellow diamonds are rarer than natural pink stones.
